## 2017 - 2018

- Work-Based Learning Instructor Manual draft developed

## 2019 - 2020

- State Chamber of Commerce Meeting with stakeholders giving an overview of work-based learning options and Perkins V
- Provided two virtual Work-Based Learning trainings for school districts

## 2021 - 2022

- DCTE's Youth Apprenticeship course name changed to Career Practicum. The Office of Skill Development (OSD) offers a Youth Apprenticeship option
- The Career Practicum work-based learning option now covers students working in paid or unpaid positions that align to their program of study
- Provided two state-wide virtual Work-Based Learning Coordinator Trainings
- Implemented the AR Seamless WBL platform for all participating schools
- Continued participation on the National Governors Association state team

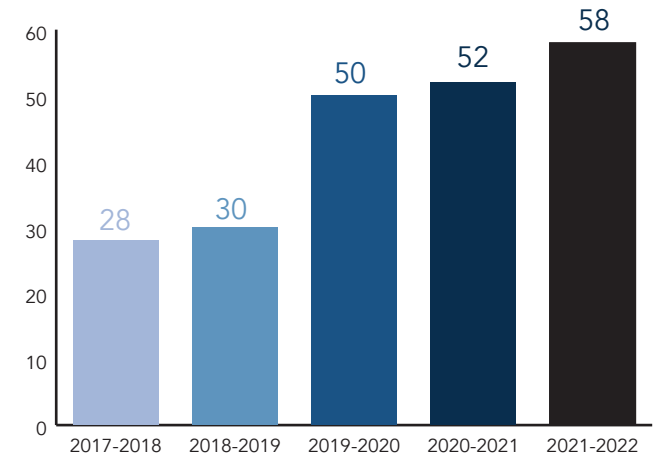
## 2018 - 2019

- Internship redefined with added accountability reports
- Youth Apprenticeship and Pre-Apprenticeship added as options to work based learning for alignment to programs of study, apprenticeship opportunities, and Perkins V
- Work-Based Learning Instructor Manuals finalized
- Provided Work-Based Learning trainings for school districts in Northwest, Central, Northeast, and Dawson Educational Coops on new work-based learning options and accountability

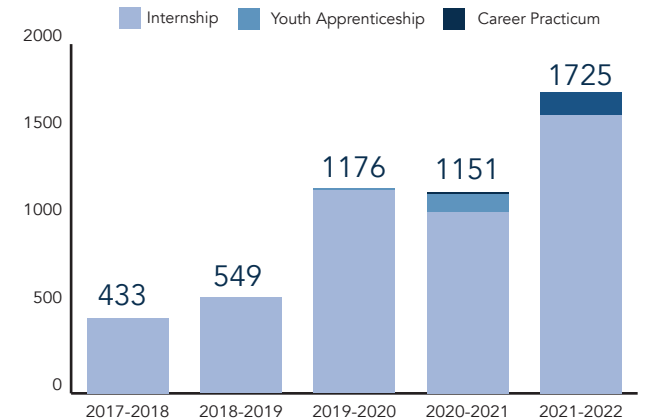
## 2020 - 2021

- At the request of stakeholders, Career Practicum was added to work-based learning options for students in unpaid positions that align to their program of study
- Youth Apprenticeship and Career Practicum Computer Science course codes were added to capture students working in the CS field for both the CS Initiative and DCTE work-based learning
- All former work-based learning options (Agricultural and Business) consolidated into the current work-based learning structure
- Participated on the National Governors Association state team with other agencies to develop a statewide work-based learning strategy
- Piloting Work-Based Learning Digital Platform
