At the request of stakeholders, Career Practicum was added to work-based learning options for students in unpaid positions that align to their program of study

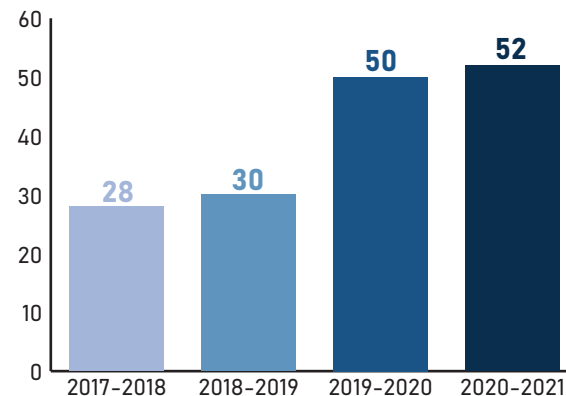
Youth Apprenticeship and Career Practicum Computer Science course codes were added to capture students working in the CS field for both the CS Initiative and DCTE work-based learning
